Ms. Ramos:

I agree with her that this is an issue. And it should be discussed at Exec Committee. Then, a motion about public/media seating can be made and passed at a future meeting. My suggestion from an idea from Mr. Young.

The behavior of Copwatch representatives at the last meeting with Chief O'Dea was unacceptable to me and to others. IA staff has repeatedly asked that Mr. Handelman be asked to relocate like anyone else from the public. By doing this, we will increase the odds the PPA will encourage officers to participate in our meetings. This will give everyone a better outcome - appellant and officer. Many of us share this belief and goal.

I alone do not have authority to move a meeting. We are all equal, voting members of an 11 member committee. Let's let the democratic process run its course.
